Message from the President, TAEU

We are the voice of the voiceless, but the voiceless must come forward to communicate their needs, and to show that the unity is our strength.

It is my great pleasure in giving this message as the President of the Teachers' Association of Eastern University.



The period of my presidentship is mingled with both the most crucial and happiest moments and incidents. The crucial period I mention here is that the TAEU had to face many challenges both internally by the Administration and by the changing government policies that took place time to time which affected the academia of the Island on the whole and individually on the membership of each trade union of the university academia.

The government of Sri Lanka had listened to the request of FUTA which voiced about the academics' tax-load and the exodus of them which had serious implications on the university education, especially on the free education system of the country. We had a series of meetings with the Chairman / UGC, both cabinet and state ministers of Education, the Prime Minister, opposition leader, other parliamentarians, and finally His Excellency the President. All of them agreed and accepted the depth of the issues on policy but we had another series of fights to get them implemented. For instance, when the Cabinet of Ministers agreed to increase the Academic Allowance of the academics, the UGC had turned it other way and finally we fought and succeeded on it. Likewise, at least a few of our demand and requests were heard, like the extension of probationary period of the academics who were suffered by the COVID -19 effects. Particularly, two of our members were affected and we were able to get it done which relived the suffered membership.

On our university side, we made several requests for our membership and some of them had been resolved (or heard) by the administration with our strong voice, and still, some of them are incomplete with pending promises by the administration. We strongly trust the requests are our demands and they shall be resolved smoothly and strongly by the administration unlike the kindled resolved matters like the Senior Assistant Librarian's.

We had many demonstrations at our university and outside university. It is very painful to disclose the "open secret" that many of our members do not participate them, we were able to count the participation, though we have more than 300 members in our union. However, when the members had personal issues, they approach TAEU and get things done in a general manner as it is the mandate of TAEU to protect the "rights" of the membership. Also, the non-participatory membership must understand that we fight for the "rights" personally and collectively. This non-participatory mentality must be avoided as we are able to witness that other university teachers' trade unions' participation which is very high, in comparison with our own Union. I strongly trust that the membership will understand my plea and give more support collectively to succeed our demands.

Another plea that put forward to our membership is that the attendance of General Body Meetings, Special General Body Meetings as such meetings are the decision-making places. I observed many times that we had to wait to get our required quorum to commence the meetings. We must understand the importance of each meeting and their decisions, rather than commenting on the decision outside the meetings. Each member has equal rights to express her/his view on the topic that is being discussed.

With those views, I once again feel happy that we, as a strong Trade Union, were able to achieve many of our demands because of the unity that we have, though many other sub-culture entities boom up and vanish in time to time.

I wish you all for good academic career and expected working environment and the forthcoming President of TAEU will continue to maintain the same momentum of the TAEU.

I am proud to say that at Eastern University, TAEU is only one teachers' union that has never compromised on these principles for individual gains offered by the administration.

I take this opportunity to extend my gratitude to President Prof. J. Kennedy for his guidance during these challenging times, to all the executive members for their unwavering support, and to the general members who form the backbone of our trade union.
